Inclusive Language & Worship

Recently our Salem Worship Ministry voted for us to update our Doxology to use more inclusive language. We will be instituting this change in worship on September 15th. I encourage everyone to read this article so we can be intentional about our faith and worship together.

As a community, we recognize the profound impact that language has on our understanding of God and each other. Our words shape our faith, and inclusive language helps us express the fullness of God's love in ways that welcome everyone.

## Why We're Updating the Doxology

The decision to update our doxology is rooted in our commitment to inclusivity. Traditional gender-specific language, while familiar, can unintentionally exclude some people. By using more inclusive language, we acknowledge that God transcends human categories like gender, allowing everyone to see themselves reflected in our worship.

Here's a look at the changes:

- "Praise God from whom all blessings flow;" replaces "Him" with "God" to emphasize God's divine nature beyond gender.
- "Praise God, all creatures here below;" invites all of creation to join in praise, highlighting the universal scope of God's blessings.
- "Praise God for all that love has done;" shifts focus to love as the core of our relationship with God and each other.
- "Creator, Christ, and Spirit One;" honors the Trinity without using gender-specific titles, reflecting God's allencompassing nature.

## The Impact on Our Worship

This change is a step toward making our worship more inclusive, ensuring that everyone feels valued and loved. While it may take some time to adjust, we believe this updated doxology will help deepen our collective connection to God and to each other. Let us embrace this new language as a reflection of our church's commitment to inclusivity and love. Together, we can create a more welcoming and inclusive community for all.


















## What is the "Neighbors in Need" special mission offering?

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice.

## <u>In 2024, the Neighbors in Need theme is "Mental</u> Health Justice For All!"

This year's focus is on Mental Health Justice. In 2015, the General Synod of the United Church of Christ passed a resolution to become WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged) for mental health. A just world for all is a world where the human rights and well-being of people with mental health challenges are respected, no matter who you are or where you are in life's mental health journey.


